Scope and Content

The Boulder Colorado Sanitarium and Hospital was founded in 1896 by Dr. John Harvey Kellogg as a branch of the Battle Creek Sanitarium. Dr. Kellogg became interested in a Colorado sanitarium in 1893, at the urging of Elder John Fulton who was in Colorado for his health. In February 1894 the sanitarium was opened in a home on University Hill. Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Keuster came from Battle Creek Sanitarium to run the facility, but were replaced a few months later by Elder and Mrs. Fulton. At this time Union College had no nursing program of its own so it collaborated with Boulder Sanitarium. Initially Union furnished recruits for Boulder Sanitarium's nurse training program; however, sanitarium training was not the same as a college nursing degree and in 1946 Union College began its own baccalaureate program. After several renovations in the 1950s, the sanitarium was replaced by Boulder Memorial Hospital which grew into present day Avista Adventist Hospital in Louisville, Colorado.

This collection contains one handbook and an original manuscript of patient records gifted by Mrs. Alta Lines Lumry of the Boulder Sanitarium graduating class of 1912.
